This week we have been learning...

This week in English we have continued to look at our class text 'Claude in the city'. We have finished our book. At the end Sir Bobblysock had to visit the doctors. On Monday we role played this situation and thought about the questions we could ask and discussed how each character was feeling and why. We have moved onto making a recount in the form of a newspaper report all about the robbery that had taken place in the art museum. We have been able to identify key features and used this to help us plan our first draft.

In maths we have looked at odd and even numbers. We have used numicon and number charts to help us find out if the number is odd or even. We have continued to practice counting on in 2's, 5's and 10's, some of us have been able to write facts about what happens to the number when we count on. We have also opened a hat shop in class where you can buy a hat, just like Claude, you can only use 2ps, 5ps and 10ps.

In our topic 'Beat the Street' we have been using google maps to create a map of London and the landmarks there. We have been able to discuss what landmarks are human or physical features. We have been locating different countries around the world using globes and atlases to compare their temperature. We have decided where we would like to go on holiday.
