This week, we have continued learning about the Stone Age with our topic: 'Changes'.

## **This week we have been learning about ...**

In English, we have been looking at the features of newspapers in preparation for writing our own next week. We have created incredibly detailed plans that we will then use to produce our very first edition of the Langley Times.

In Maths, have been focusing upon our understanding of addition and subtraction. We have been looking at the way in which numbers can be represented in different ways using the bar and part whole model. We have investigated the way in which multiples of 100 can be used to show numbers in a range of ways using different methods of recording.

In our afternoon topic sessions, we have been creating our own versions of Neolithic period settlements and created maps with keys to show our understanding of how the people lived in the 'New Stone Age'. Fortune class were also lucky to be recruited this week by the British Geologic Society. We were alerted to seismic activity in the local area which, fortunately for us, brought to the surface a range of ancient artefacts. We will continue to investigate our finds over the course of next week.
