Our inquiry into how we know about Ancient Greece began this week by making our own Greek pots out of clay. We are now waiting for them to dry, ready to paint with scenes from Ancient Greek life.

We have used the myths to find clues as to what everyday life might have been like and the technology we knew they had. Through Daedalus and Icarus we found out that they had compasses, saws, temples and that different parts of Greece were ruled by different kings.

In maths, we have continued our work on our multiplication tables, focusing primarily on the 11 and 12 times tables. We have also been using 'factor rainbows' to find factors of a number.

Read Theory.


Times Table Practice.
